
 Hindus are free to imagine Him or Her in any way that is meaningful to them


HINDU DEITIES

God of Creation




 Not worshiped as much as Vishnu and Shiva because he is seen right now "not to do anything because he will not be at work again until the universe dies


HINDU DEITIES: BRAHMA

Physical Appearance

- Depicted with four heads, four arms and four faces
- White beard
- Holds no weapons
- Holds a book, scepter, prayer beads, gold crown
- Sits on a lotus



HINDU DEITIES: BRAHMA symbolizes the four Vedas The Four Heads- God of creation, one head looking each way at earth, judge of reincarnation




<u>Symbolism of Appearance</u>

Four Arms- represent the four cardinal directions (North, East, South West).


- Back right hand represents the mind
- Back left hand represents intellect
- Front right hand is ego
- Front left hand is self-confidence




HINDU DEITIES: BRAHMA Symbolism of Appearance Prayer Beads- used to tell time and the substances used in the process of creation




HINDU DEITIES: BRAHMA Symbolism of Appearance The Book- symbolizes the intelligence and knowledge that Brahma has



HINDU DEITIES: BRAHMA Symbolism of Appearance The Gold- symbolizes Brahma complete authority and that he is actively involved in the process of creating the Universe



HINDU DEITIES: BRAHMA Symbolism of Appearance The Crown- symbolizes Brahma's complete authority




HINDU DEITIES: BRAHMA The Lotus- symbolizes the beauty of nature and the living essence of all things in the universe.






HINDU DEITIES: BRAHMA Symbolism of Appearance The Beard- symbolizes the wisdom and the eternal process of the creation



HINDU DEITIES: BRAHMA The Scepter-symbolizes the pouring of the holy oil, indicating that he is the lord of sacrifices.



HINDU DEITIES: BRAHMA Vehicle is a Hamsa (bird)



The bird is usually depicted as a swan because it is beautiful and graceful

Purest of colors because it symbolizes goodness

Bird has the ability to separate milk from water

HINDU DEITIES: BRAHMA That symbolizes that Brahma can help humans to assimilate right from wrong





The bird usually moves on water

Water symbolizing our consciousness and that means that Brahma moves about purifying our consciousness


Spirits placed a seed in the water

• The seed became a golden egg






 Brahma was self born in the Lotus flower



 Connection of the lotus brings Brahma together with Vishnu.


Primordial fetus and Primordial placenta

 Brahma is involved in creation, but Vishnu continues thereafter


• Legend has it that Brahma created a woman named Saraswati.



 As soon as Brahma saw his creation, he fell in love with her

 Saraswati was shy and tried to avoid Brahma's gaze by rising to the sky because none of his heads look to the sky

 To keep an eye of Saraswati Brahma grew a fifth head



• The fifth head is said to be cut off by Shiva

 Brahma spoke disrespectfully about Shiva which angered him so much that he opened his third eye and burned Brahma's fifth head off

HINDU DEITIES: BRAHMA WORSHIP TEMPLES

Though almost all Hindu religious rites involve prayer to Brahma, very few temples are dedicated to his worship

 Once a year on Kartik Poornima, the full moon night of the Hindu lunar month of Kartik a religious festival is held in Brahmans honor
