
HT3M- 2.3 Hindu Concept of God (b) Vishnu



Vishnu

The name Vishnu means "to settle",
"to enter into, and to pervade"

 To sum up we will refer to the name meaning, "the All-Pervading One"

Four Arms

 Represents his allpowerful and allpervasive nature



Four Arms

Symbolize the four stages of human life




4 Stages of Life

The quest for knowledge

Family Life

Retreat into the Forest

Renunciation



The two back arms signify the Lord's activity in the spiritual world

The two front arms signify the Lord's activity in the physical world



The right side of Vishnu's body represents the creative activities of the mind an the intellect

The left side represents the activities of the heart (love, kindness and compassion)



In the upper right hand which represents the revolving or creative tendency, he holds the conch symbol of the 5 universal elements

Conch also represents universal maintenance



5 Universal Elements (Conch is the fountain that evolves the elements)



Conch also indicates that the Lord communicates with his devotees with love and understanding

When blowing the conch he reminds his devotees to live in this world with kindness and compassion towards all living beings




In the upper left hand he holds the discus

It represents cohesive tendency, shining like an infant sun and a symbol of the mind



Wheel of life, think as a water wheel

Life fills and empties due to forces innate in nature



In the lower right hand Vishnu holds a lotus

When Vishnu contemplated the creation of mankind, a lotus sprang out of his navel



Seated on it was the four-headed Brahma, illuminating all the directions with his brightness

This lotus lit up the sky with its effulgence and was identified with the sun



The lotus was the creative matrix from which all of the world eventually evolved, the lotus thereby became a symbol of creation and fertility



The lotus in Vishnu's hand also denotes his better half and constant companion, the source from which he derives his powers, namely Goddess Lakshmi



Lakshmi is the goddess of prosperity who sits on a lotus and also holds stalks of the same flower in her hands.

Thus the lotus is also the feminine force that activates the creative power of Lord Vishnu, like Shakti does for her Shiva.



In the bottom left hand is the Mace

the mace represents the power of time

Just as nothing can conquer time, the mace too is unconquerable and destroys those who oppose



Thus does Vishnu describe himself: "The world rests as the lotus in the palm of my hand, the cosmos revolves around my finger like a discus. I blow the music of life through my conch and wield my mace to protect all creatures."




In visual imagery an upright Vishnu stands with each of his four arms holding a different symbolic attribute

He is straight as a post,

For he is the firm center, and the axis of the universe,



He is the sturdy pillar that joins the earth to the heavens




The other popular icon of Vishnu shows him in a dreamlike state reclining upon a mighty serpent and floating upon the primordial waters.

This image is Vishnu at his purest



World planning is the work of Vishnu, who symbolizes the universal intellect.

The three states of mind (sleep, dream, and awareness) are the relative conditions corresponding to the Hindu trinity



Thus Shiva is experienced in the dreamless sleep,

Vishnu in the vision of dreams

Brahma in the state of awareness.



Vishnu in his dream state represents that gap in time someone awaits the birth of a new age

At the physical plane it is parallel to the sperm floating in the germinating waters of the womb when creation can happen at any instant.



The snake denotes the mind and the multiple heads denotes the innumerable desires and passions of the individual

Just as a snake destroys its victim by its venom, an uncontrolled mind destroys the world by the venon of it's possessiveness



The blue sky in the background:

Suggests that he pervades the whole universe

Blue color symbolizes infinity

Blue body of Vishnu symbolizes that he has infinite attributes



The yellow symbolizes:

Earthly existence

Yellow clothes represents that he incarnates himself on this earth to uphold righteousness and destroy all evil and unrighteousness



Flower Garland:

Symbol of the devotees adoration for the Lord.

Gem on Neck:

Signifies that the Lord fullfills all genuine desires of his devotees and provides for their needs.



The Crown:

Symbol of the Lords supreme power and authority


Two Earrings:


